

Use a black paint pen or permanent marker on the base of a puzzle to outline and better define where each puzzle piece fits. You can color in the puzzle hole on the base and color the back of the puzzle piece to match (using a different color for each piece) for an extra clue. Cheating? Not at all–just another way to learn how to do the job!
